WEST LIBERTY TO RECEIVE NEW EARLY WARNING SIREN

WEST LIBERTY - The Logan County EMA received an \$8,000 grant toward the purchase of a new public safety siren for the West Liberty Fire Department.

The remaining cost of the siren is being split three ways between the Village of West Liberty, Adriel School and Green Hills Retirement Community.

The total cost of the siren is \$21,314. The three entities are each putting in \$4,438.

“So many people have been able to help us when we need assistance so it only seemed appropriate that we help the community when we can,” said Mike Ray, President/CEO of Green Hills Retirement Community.

The new siren will be installed on the Adriel campus. Mike Mullins, CEO of Adriel, said, “The community of West Liberty has helped support our mission for many years, and we are delighted to be able to give back by helping with the siren.” Expected to be delivered in January, the siren will weigh about 927 pounds.

- The siren can be used for all types of hazard warnings such as Severe Weather/Tornado, Chemical Spills and Flood warnings
