Adriel Auction Raises \$60,000

WEST LIBERTY, OH – Just over \$60,000 was raised at the Adriel Quilt Auction on October 15 and 16. Proceeds from the auction benefit Adriel's foster care and adoption and residential programs for children.

Pictured is auctioneer Kevin Frey, center stage, of Archbold, starting off the bidding on the "Mariner's Star" quilt, donated by Shelley Wammes of West Liberty. It was the top-selling quilt of the day. Over 200 items, including 118 quilts, were auctioned.

During the auction preview on Friday evening, the public had a chance to vote on their favorite quilt. This year, the people's choice first place award went to an appliquéd quilt called, "Rose of Sharon-Lily of the Valley," which was donated by the Maple Grove Mennonite Women of Hartville, Ohio.



Adriel, founded as an orphan's home by the Mennonite Church in 1896, is a not-for-profit agency that provides foster care, adoption, and residential treatment services for children who have been abused and neglected. Adriel is licensed by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services, certified by the Ohio Department of Mental Health, accredited by COA, and is a Certified Teaching Family Sponsor Site.
